With shows every 2 hours on the half, enjoy the Motus O Dancers in celebration of our country's sesquicentennial with "From Far and Wide Canada"



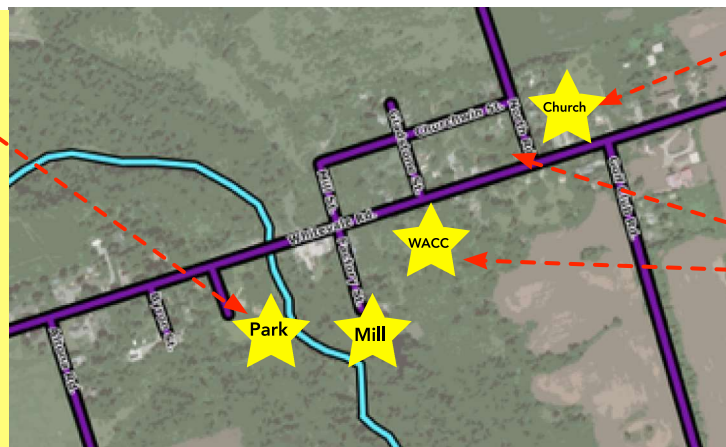

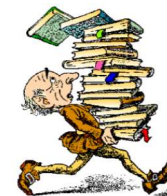
### Whitevale Arts & Culture Centre
